Uniform and Appearance Policy

Background

Uniform is an important part of the College, as it creates a sense of belonging and identity, and is required to be worn by all enrolled students. It is a condition of the enrolment at the College that students conform to the Uniform requirements. Full uniform must be worn while the student travels to and from the College.

Scope

The College uniform serves the purpose of:

- enhancing positive interaction between students;
- promoting the College in the community;
- creating responsibility and accountability;
- eliminating issues surrounding clothing;
- minimising financial obligation of parents relating to the purchase of expensive clothing items (e.g. different outfits);
- creating a sense of belonging and positive school culture; and
- creating and enhancing a sense/culture of equity.

The Uniform Policy is monitored and implemented by GBC teaching staff.

Policy

It is a condition of enrolment that students comply with the uniform requirements while in the College and also while travelling to and from school. All students enrolled at the College are required to wear the College uniform, except Kindergarten students for whom it is optional.

Exceptions (Temporary)

All students are required to wear the College uniform unless a parent/guardian requests a temporary exception and gets approval by the College. Students must have a written explanation if they are not in correct uniform on any given day, to obtain a temporary uniform pass. Temporary exceptions may be granted due to medical or other qualifying circumstances - which are assessed on a case-by-case basis. The College has the right to recall all previously granted exceptions — if the surrounding circumstances change or if constraints cause any misunderstanding of the temporary nature of the exception.

Policy Guidelines

Christian principles and modesty standards

As part of GBC's Christian ethos and values, students need to maintain a high level of modesty at all times. As per Goldfields Baptist College's uniform policy and the College rules, uniform will be worn the majority of the time. However, at times, and with the permission of the Principal, students may wear free dress. This may include organised free dress days, afterschool programs, specialist classes, work experience, camps and other school based events.

During non-uniform times, modesty and appropriateness must be displayed and students must refrain from wearing:

- Inappropriate or skimpy clothing;
- Tank tops, singlets or other string strap style tops that may expose the shoulders;
- Short skirts, dresses or 'short shorts' that may expose the legs above the knees must comply
 with the College's standard of dress must be knee high. The only exception is official College
 sports shorts or skirts (e.g. netball);
- Free dress with inappropriate writing/images which contradict the Christian ethos of the College;
- Bikinis or revealing swimwear must be sports type or be completely covered by board shorts and a rash vest:
- Oversized and/or undersized garments do not fit the uniform requirements.

Uniform Management Strategies

- Pastoral care teachers will check every morning for uniform compliance.
- Students with unexplained (by a parent/guardian) non-compliant uniform items will be given a verbal warning.
- Students who are non-compliant for a second time, in a short period of time, will be given a written warning in their diaries to be signed by a parent.
- Any further non-compliance with the uniform policy in a short period of time, may result in a parent interview to be conducted by the appropriate team leader.
- Blatant non-compliance with the uniform policy or intentional breaches may result in immediate action such as parent collection.
- Any further non-compliance will result in an interview with the appropriate team leader and the Principal and may result in an internal suspension and/or review of student enrolment.
- If all communication and compliance strategies fail, further non-compliance may result in termination of enrolment.
- All uniform issues will be assessed on a case by case basis and, where possible, the College will work with parent/guardians to enter a partnership agreement.

Uniform - Summer Uniform: Term 1 and 4 - Winter Uniform: Term 2 and 3.

FORMAL UNIFORM PRIMARY (Year 1-6):

GIRLS BOYS

Bottoms - Summer:

College skirts with navy socks.

Bottoms - Summer & Winter:

College shorts or College trousers with navy socks.

Bottoms - Winter:

College skirts with navy socks or opaque navy/black tights.

Shirt: Lemon shirts with College logo to be worn all year.

College jumper/tracksuit top is to be worn on cold days. Students may wear long-sleeved navy vests underneath shirts in very cold weather.

Shoes: Black leather school shoes.

Hats: A College hat must be worn at all times when outdoors.

FORMAL UNIFORM SECONDARY (Year 7-10):

GIRLS BOYS

Bottoms - Summer: Bottoms - Summer & Winter:
College skirts with white socks. College shorts or College trousers

with navy socks.

Trousers are required for formal events.

Bottoms - Winter:

College skirts with opaque navy/black tights or white socks.

Shirt: White shirts with College logo to be worn all year.

Navy ties are worn in Winter. A singlet, if worn, must be white. College jumper/tracksuit top is to be worn on cold days.

Shoes: Black leather school shoes.

Hats: A College hat must be worn at all times when outdoors.

Optional uniform items for Primary and Secondary girls:

Dresses are optional for girls in summer. They are not part of the formal uniform. Skirts must be worn when formal uniform is specified (i.e. Presentation Night, Photo Day, Speech Night etc.).

PHYSICAL EDUCATION UNIFORM (ALL YEAR GROUPS):

Shirt: College orange sport shirt with logo

Shorts: College navy sport shorts (refer to uniform policy for length)

Tracksuit: College tracksuit pants and jacket

Shoes: Proper sport shoes
Socks: White sport socks

Hats: A College hat must be worn at all times when outdoors

Students in sporting teams are required to wear appropriate team attire.

Pre-Primary

Students in Pre-Primary wear the Physical Education Uniform with sport shoes.

Kindergarten

It is not compulsory for Kindergarten students to wear College Uniform; however, parents may wish them to wear the orange sport shirt.

If a College uniform item is not available from the GBC Uniform Shop, an alternate will be suggested and allowed until the item is restocked. The Uniform Co-ordinator will advise the parent/guardian of suitable substitution and will liaise with the College so that a temporary exception is automatically applied.

Footwear

Shoes: Black, polished leather school shoes are compulsory for students at the College (from Year 1-10). Shoes must be "heeled" but with heels not higher than 20mm, measured from the inside of the heel. Lace-up shoes must be properly tied. Unacceptable styles include:

- Brogues i.e. shoes that have a punched pattern,
- Chunky type shoes,
- Shoes with coloured stitching or coloured shoe laces,
- Ballet slippers and buckled shoes.

Sport Shoes: Must be cross trainer or running shoes, predominantly white with white laces or black with black laces is preferred (The College acknowledges that colour is subject to availability and 'seasonal trends'). Skate shoes, Basketball shoes and Volleys are not permitted.

Orthotics: Clarks "Detroit" is an acceptable shoe and is designed for orthotics. Boots are not acceptable.

Bags

- The school bag is part of the school uniform.
- Primary College students must leave their bags outside their classroom in a neat order.
- Secondary College students must lock their bags away in their lockers.
- Bags must be kept in good condition and should be free from graffiti and unnecessary decoration.
- Unsatisfactory bags will need to be replaced.
- All bags must be named.

Bathers

Modesty is required when wearing bathers for any College activity. One-piece bathers will be worn by girls. Sun-shirts are acceptable; however, T-shirts are not acceptable. Girls may wear board shorts and a sun-shirt provided it is worn over their bathers.

Appearance

Students' appearance must be neat and tidy at all times and comply with the College uniform policy.

Nails

Hair

Long hair must be tied back in a ponytail or plaits only.

Hair is to be kept natural colour – hair dyes should not be used in the Primary section of the College. In Secondary, only neutral or light tones are acceptable. Unusual or extreme colours are not permissible.

Any colour or style deemed to be unacceptable, according to the College policy, will require parent contact and rectification.

excessive teasing or gel use.

No Pony Tails, dreadlocks, Mohawk, 'tails' (mullet style), shaved (unless for health reasons) or other extremes of fashion are permitted.

Hair must be above the collar and the fringe may not pass the eye brows.

No hair dye to be used.

Jewellery

Jewellery must not be worn – unless it is approved in accordance with the GBC uniform policy.

One plain (gold or silver) stud or sleeper in the lower ear lobe is the only ear jewellery that is permissible.

No noticeable body, nose, face or other piercings are permissible.

A chain with a cross is allowed – provided it is worn under the uniform – it should not be worn during sports or other practical subject (Design and Technology etc.).

A traditional, culturally significant, 'greenstone' pendant is permissible – provided it is worn under the uniform – it should not be worn during sports or other practical subject (Design and Technology etc.).

Any other chain or pendant cannot be worn – without the permission of the Principal or their delegate.

No rings or other fashion items are permissible.

Students who choose to wear other jewellery risk its confiscation with the item being returned only to a parent/guardian or at the end of the school term.

At times, it may be necessary to confiscate items of jewellery. Although all care will be taken with jewellery, the College accepts no liability for confiscated items.

Jewellery must not be worn – unless it is approved in accordance with the GBC uniform policy.

No earrings are permissible (including clear plugs).

No noticeable body, nose, face or other piercings are permissible.

A chain with a cross is allowed – provided it is worn under the uniform – it should not be worn during sports or other practical subject (Design and Technology etc.).

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Shaving
All boys must be clean shaven during the school
day and at all College events. Sideburns should
not extend down past the earlobe.

Uniform Standards

In addition to wearing the appropriate items of clothing and conforming to all the requirements for makeup, hair and grooming, students are expected to keep their uniform in good condition and wear it properly and modestly.

All students must comply with the following:

- The shirt should be tucked in fully, not rolled up;
- The top button of the shirt must be done up at all times when wearing a tie;
- The tie should be neatly tied and pulled up so that it covers the top button;
- The tie should be a reasonable length;
- Shoes should be clean and polished;
- Shorts should be worn neatly with waist band above the hip and the hem touching the knee;
- Boys' trousers should be worn neatly with the waist band above the hip;
- In all cases, socks must completely cover the ankle;
- Girls' socks should be worn short and neatly folded down;
- · Skirts and dresses must be knee length.

Purchasing of uniform

Parents/guardians are required to purchase items from the College Uniform Shop. Good second-hand items are advertised in the Uniform Shop. The Uniform Shop is open on Thursday mornings from 8am to 10am. Orders can also be placed via email or via the order sheets outside the uniform shop.

Lost Property

Lost Property is placed in a box in the foyer of the Administration Building. If not claimed, items are recycled at the end of each term though the Uniform Shop, or donated to a charitable organisation. We strongly recommend parents/guardians label all student uniforms.

Non-compliance with uniform and appearance code

Requiring students to wear the correct College uniform at all times in accordance with College policy is the direct and sole responsibility of parents/guardians. Parents/guardians accept that uniform instils a sense of positive identity within the College and will ensure that the uniform is clean and neat and kept in good repair.

If for an unavoidable reason a student is unable to meet the uniform requirements on a particular day, parents/guardians are requested to forward a note with explanation to the Pastoral Care (PC) Teacher – considered as an application for temporary exception. The PC Teacher will issue the student with a uniform pass for the day or according to the circumstances, and within the bounds of College policy.

Where parents/guardians are experiencing financial difficulty with purchasing a uniform, they should contact the Principal for assistance.

Where a student's dress does not meet the College requirements and no explanation has been forthcoming, parents/guardians will be notified and a solution found.

In cases where students for medical reasons need an exemption or modification to a component of

the uniform and appearance code, a medical certificate is required and a formal notification of the exemption will be sent to parents/guardians and staff.

Seasons

Students should dress in Summer Uniform during Term 1 and 4, and in Winter Uniform during Term 2 and 3 unless otherwise indicated by the College in extreme weather conditions out of the normal climate patterns. Teachers will specify the uniform appropriate for individual excursions. The usual procedure for excursions is Summer uniform in Term 1 and 4, Winter uniform Term 2 and 3 and Winter or Formal uniform on special representative occasions. The Sports Uniform is worn on Sport days and on PE days.

Pre-Primary - Year 6 students may wear plain **navy blue long sleeved vests** or shirts underneath their polo shirts on very cold days. No turtle neck or collared varieties. Parents can buy these at any store; as they are not stocked in the Uniform Shop.

Due to the varying Autumn and Spring temperatures, students will have the option to wear either their Winter or Summer uniform during Term 2 until the end of Week 4 and during Term 4 until the end of Week 4. Students may not mix the two uniforms; it must be either Winter or Summer uniform.

Hats

Goldfields Baptist College is a Sunsmart school and requires hats to be worn all year round. GBC encourages children and employees to wear legionnaire style, bucket or broad brimmed hats that protect the face, neck and ears whenever they are outside – students must only wear the College hat. Children who do not have their hats with them will be asked to play in an area protected from the sun.

Electives

Some elective classes, such as Sports Studies and Drama, may warrant the wearing of sports uniform for the time they are in class, in order for students to comfortably and safely participate. Students must change into required clothing at the break before the class and get changed back into their Formal College uniform at the break closest to the end of the class.

Exams

During exam times, student may choose to wear the sports uniform or their formal College uniform, to allow for comfort. A mixture of sports and formal should not be worn, however, discretion during this time will be applied.

Gum-free

Goldfields Baptist College is a gum-free College.

Policy Review This policy may be reviewed periodically and republished, as applicable. The Principal may issue additional instructions within the policy framework as appropriate.
